Michael "Mike" Nordness Named New Chief Administrative Officer for Delray Medical Center and Group Chief Operating Officer for the Palm Beach Health Network

Before his time in Jacksonville, Nordness was the Assistant Administrator at Haywood Regional Medical Center in Clyde, North Carolina. There, Nordness focused his efforts on throughput, operations, labor management and productivity. He then became the Chief Operating Officer at Lake Norman Regional Medical Center in Mooresville, North Carolina. During his time there, Nordness successfully launched an interventional cardiology program, led the facility through a number of development projects, and recruited physicians for key service lines.

Nordness is a graduate of the University of Wisconsin-Whitewater with a undergraduate degree in education. He went on to receive his Master's degree from the University of Wisconsin-La Crosse with an emphasis in health education. Nordness then earned his Master's in Business Administration from the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee.
