SalusCare eliminates wait for outpatient psychiatric services

Residential treatment for ages 13-17 for substance use diagnosis also immediately available

FORT MYERS, Fla. January 27, 2022 — SalusCare's Outpatient Psychiatry team has worked through issues caused by damage from Hurricane Ian to now provide services without wait times.

Here is how to get help:

• WALK-IN psychiatric services for children and adults are

available from 8 a.m. to 2 p.m. Monday through Thursday at Evans Avenue Campus, 3763 Evans Ave., Fort Myers. Individuals coming during walk-in times can expect to receive an initial no-cost screening by a qualified staff member. If services are needed, a same-day appointment will be made with a provider. Some days do reach capacity, so arrive early. If this happens, SalusCare will assist in scheduling an appointment.

• CALL 239-275-3222 to schedule a 30-minute phone screening appointment and then be scheduled with an experienced, qualified and compassionate provider within a few days.

In addition, residential treatment for substance use diagnosis is immediately available at the Vince Smith Center for teens ages 13 to 17. The therapeutic environment provides 24-hour supervision, with education provided by the Lee County School District in-house and GED options.

"Providing the mental and behavioral healthcare needed for our community has been our highest priority since Hurricane Ian damaged some of our facilities," said Stacey Cook, CEO of SalusCare. "We have worked very hard to streamline access to our services and shorten the amount of time to engage in services."
