# St. Mary's Medical Center & The Palm Beach Children's Hospital Promote Cynthia McCauley to Chief Executive Officer

McCauley is a healthcare executive who has worked in a variety of roles during her close to 20-year tenure with Tenet. Prior to her appointment as CAO of St. Mary’s and Palm Beach Children’s last year, she served as the Chief Executive Officer of Tenet Florida Physician Services (TFPS), one of the largest multi-specialty physician groups in South Florida. Under her leadership, TFPS has grown exponentially to over 225 providers and 800 employees, providing care for over 536,000 patients annually across the communities of Palm Beach, Broward and Miami-Dade counties. Her continued success is demonstrated through numerous awards including being recognized as one of the “25 Most Influential Business Women in South Florida” by the South Florida Business Journal. McCauley was also a nominee for the Athena Award in Palm Beach County. She serves as a Board member of GCI Worldwide Corporation, and was a panelist at the Extraordinary Women Leading Change Conference.

Prior to joining TFPS, she served as the Chief Financial Officer at sister hospital Good Samaritan Medical Center in West Palm Beach, West Boca Medical Center in Boca Raton and North Ridge Medical Center in Fort Lauderdale. Her career with Tenet began as the Director of Finance at Delray Medical Center. Before coming to Tenet, she was the Regional Director of Finance at a public hospital in Broward for 11 years. She holds an MBA in Finance from Long Island University, and a BA in Foreign Language from Adelphi University.

Pediatric services are provided at the Palm Beach Children's Hospital at St. Mary's Medical Center, which is the only dedicated children's hospital between Ft. Lauderdale and Orlando. Along with 24/7 dedicated pediatric emergency and trauma care, Palm Beach Children's Hospital's medical staff consists of 196 pediatricians in 36 subspecialties. These include limb reconstruction and lengthening at the Paley Orthopedic and Spine Institute, pediatric oncology program, which includes membership in the Children's Oncology Group – a clinical trials group supported by the National Cancer Institute, and pediatric orthopedics. In addition, in-house pediatric intensivists work with area pediatricians to care for children while staying at Palm Beach Children's Hospital.

St. Mary's Medical Center is fully accredited by the Joint Commission, the nation's oldest and largest hospital accreditation agency, and is a member of the Children's Hospital Association. The hospital has won many prestigious awards, including the Tenet Circle of Excellence award.
